

Research Intern (Find a Solution Programme)

This internship is part of the Find a Solution programme which brings together current students and local Third Sector organisations to tackle issues of strategic importance through projects that will have a lasting impact.

We provide a range of therapeutic services for people affected by childhood sexual abuse. We work with children and adults of all genders. We have the Platinum Investors in People Award reflecting our commitment to staff and volunteers. We currently have the Bronze Charter Award reflecting our commitment to the LGBT Community.

The role is to explore and report on the barriers to accessing our services for people from ethnic minority communities in North Lanarkshire, and to make suggestions as to how we can extend our reach.

The ideal candidate would be someone who has excellent communication skills, is reliable, can work to tight deadlines and use their initiative whilst working effectively within the team.

This internship will take place during June and July for 20 hours per week for 8 weeks. The role will be hybrid.
