Notes following the Fifth Meeting, 21st May 2008

The fifth meeting of the GCSG took place in Room 1, Dept of English Language, University of Glasgow. Thanks are due to David Simmons, who acted as master of ceremonies, and to Christian Kay who organized the refreshments.

Apologies were received from Jan Hendry, Fiona Macpherson and Valerie Thornton.

This meeting was our first anniversary event, as the Group is now one year old – our first meeting took place in April 2007. Our anniversay event was as follows:

John Lynn spoke on 'Colour Application Within Film Media: Accuracy Versus Artistic Effect'.

Dr Lynn, Division of Creative Technologies, School of Engineering and Computing, Glasgow Caledonian University, delighted his audience with a collection of film-clips from some very well-known films. In his commentary he pointed out various aspects of the use of colour, including 'dressing the set' (interesting uses of background colour) and symbolic usages of colour to indicate, for example, danger, unpleasant events, and emotions such as happiness, although with a warning that such symbolism is often culturally restricted. The audience also saw examples of colour grading, in which the colours of the same object or person change as the scene progresses, and the use of colour as a prop to create a recurring theme, or to draw the eye to a particular point. Ending with some comments on technical problems, and posing some questions for future consideration, such as how such colour effects can be measured, Dr Lynn concluded a most thought-provoking presentation. The organizing committee would like to thank him for such an interesting event.
