

# University Library information for prospective students



One of the most important considerations when deciding where to study is the library. The University of Glasgow Library is at the heart of the campus, with great opening times and one of the largest collections of books in Europe.

We're really proud of our library – in 2012 the International Student Barometer voted our online resources best in the United Kingdom and the Library gained the top rating in Scotland in the National Student Survey.

If you choose to become a student at the University of Glasgow, you'll have access to over 35,000 e-journals and e-books and over 2.5m books. There's a college librarian for every subject plus a full range of library services provided by a friendly and professional team of staff. It's a really great research library with a newly-opened postgraduate study space.

Substantial investments have been made in the Library over the past few years, meaning we can provide a comfortable and safe study environment, with 2,500 study spaces and over 800 student computers. The building has Wi-Fi throughout, with zoned areas ranging from group study to silent study. There's a comfortable cafe if you need to take a break or meet with your friends.

The building is open 361 days of the year from 7.15am to 2.00am. With such extensive opening hours, you can study at a time that suits you. Our e-resources such as databases, e-books and journals are available to you 24/7 from our website www.glasgow.ac.uk/services/library.

### **About the Library**

The University Library has been in existence since the foundation of the University in 1451, and has always been at the centre of the University community. Relocating from the city centre in 1870 to the Gilmorehill campus, the Library continued to evolve and adapt, moving again in 1968 to its current location – a 12 storey building on Hillhead Street.

The Library's collections cover most branches of the arts, sciences, social sciences and medicine. They are complemented by rare books, manuscripts and early photographs in our Special Collections Department which has an international reputation. The department has some of the rarest books in the world such as Shakespeare's First Folio and an Adam Smith 1st edition copy of the Wealth of Nations. www.glasgow.ac.uk/services/specialcollections
