Although your interest is likely to be in social science subjects, you can choose to take an arts or science subject too!

### Why Glasgow?

An Honours degree at Glasgow offers you the flexibility to study a range of subjects in your first two years, giving you a breadth of experience before deciding what subjects you would like to specialise in for your final degree. If you choose to specialise in one subject, you will study on a Single Honours degree and if you choose to specialise in two subjects, you will study on a Joint Honours degree.

### The flexible degree structure

Many of our students take advantage of our flexible degree structure. You will benefit from this system-whether you know exactly what subjects you want to study, or you need a little more time to work it out.

It lets you try out up to four subjects over your first two years before you make a final decision at the end of your second year about the subjects you want to specialise in at Honours level.

Throughout the four years of an Honours degree, the first two years are wide ranging and broaden your learning; the last two allow you to deepen your learning by letting you focus more on your developing interests.

### How does it work?

In first year you normally choose Level-1 courses in three different subjects. In second year you normally go on with at least two of your Level-1 subjects at Level-2, and introduce another subject at Level-1.

At the end of the second year you will normally progress to the Honours years of the degree, although you can finish your studies at the end of third year with an MA in Social Sciences Ordinary degree.

#### Two pre-Honours years Choose three Level-1 courses. Maximum flexibility SOCIOLOGY **POLITICS ECONOMICS** comes from choosing three subjects, any one of which LEVEL 1 LEVEL 1 could be continued as a Single Honours degree in Social Sciences. **ECONOMICS** Choose two Level-2 courses. These are carried forward & SOCIAL **POLITICS ECONOMICS** from two Level-1 courses. This preserves two possible LEVEL 2 LEVEL 2 **HISTORY** Single Honours paths which continues flexibility. LEVEL 1 Choose a fourth Level-1 course to assist breadth. Two Honours years Year 3 – Junior Honours **ECONOMICS** Choose two Honours paths, both together will lead to a Joint (not Single) Honours degree. Flexibility LEVELS 3 and breadth of degree now gives way to depth. Year 4 – Senior Honours **ECONOMICS** At the end of your final Honours year graduate with LEVELS 4 an MA (Social Sciences) degree with Joint (not Single)
