Additional Support for students facing financial hardship	Discretionary Funds – annual grant assistance towards costs of accommodation, childcare, disability, special needs, support for mature students	
(available to registered University of Glasgow students)	Hardship Fund – short to medium-term one-off support in the form of a grant or loan (for students facing financial hardship who have exhausted all other avenues of support).
