THE PERSONS.

The manuscript descriptions of the *dramatis personæ* both vary from 1725 text as follows:

Title: Dramatis Personæ (D3 EUL), Persons in the Play (NLS) [not 'The Persons.']

Men (D₃ EUL; NLS)

Sr Colin MacAndre (D2 EUL), Sir Colin – a Gentleman who being engagd in the [redacted] Royal Intrest was obliged to leave his Countrey while the Rebles assumed the Government under Oliver Cromwell (D3 EUL), Sr William Worthy, father to Patie (NLS) [not 'Sir WILLIAM WORTHY.']

Patie – soposed son to old Symon (D2 EUL), supposed son to Symon, only son & heir of Sir Colin in Love with Pegie (D3 EUL), Patie the Gentle Shepherd in Love with Peggie (NLS) [not 'PATIE, *The Gentle Shepherd in love with* Peggy.']

Roger – a wealthy young shepherd (D2 EUL), a young rich shepherd in Love with Jenny (D3 EUL), Roger a rich young Shep^d in Love with Jenny (NLS) [not 'ROGER, *a rich young Shepherd in love with* Jenny.']

Symon – ane old shepherd husband to Elspith [loyal](D2 EUL), a faithfull old Tenant of Sir Colins with whome he Leaves his only Son while a Child to be brought up as his own till time brought about some Hoped for good Event (D3 EUL) [not (with Glaud) 'Two old Sheheprds Tenants to Sir William.']

Glaud – father to Jenny & suposd uncle to Peggy a widower redacted (D2 EUL), another good old hearty Tennant Nighbour to Symon father to Jenny & suposed Uncle to Pegy' (D3 EUL) [not (with Symon) 'Two old Sheheprds Tenants to Sir William.']

Bauldy Hind engagd (NLS) [not 'Hyd engaged']; a Hynd (D2 EUL), A young farmer engadge with Neps fals in Love with Pegie (D3 EUL [not 'a Hynd engaged with Neps.']

Women (D₃ EUL; NLS) [not 'WOMEN.']

[Mause] Pegie alias Saintclara — Heires of a forfieted fortune Left [redacted] none to take care of her but her mothers old Nurse (D₃ EUL), Peggy thought to be Glauds nice, nice to Sir W^m (NLS) [not 'PEGGY, *thought to be* Glaud's *Niece*.']

Jeny — daughter to Glaud (D₃ EUL), Jenny Glauds only Daughter (NLS) [not 'JENNY, Glaud's *only Daughter*.']

Madge an Θ old Maiden house keeper to Glaud- a wierd (D2 EUL), Lucky Runcle (D2 EUL), Mause — who Lays her doun to Glaud who bringsher up as his oun Nice while Mause takes a cotage hard-by to lake underhand notice of her and passes amang some of the Countrey for a witch (D3 EUL), Mause, an old Woman thought to be a Witch (NLS) [not 'MAUSE, *an old Woman supposed to be a Witch*.']

Elspith - wife to Symon (D2 EUL), Elspa - wife to Symon (D3 EUL) [not 'ELSPA, Symon's *Wife*.']

Madge [not listed in D₂ EUL, though this is the name given to Mause, or D₃ EUL] Glauds Sister (NLS) [not 'MADGE, Glaud's *Sister*.']

Scene a shepherds Vilage, and fields some few miles from Edinburgh (NLS) [not 'SCENE, a Shepherds Village and Fields some few Miles from Edinburgh.']

Time of Action within twenty-four Hours (NLS) [not 'within Twenty Hours.'] NLS does not include the time of the various acts.

Title: The Gentle Shepherd & Shepherdesse or Patie & Pegie a Dramatick Pastoral (D₃ EUL), The Gentle Shepherd a Pastoral Comedie (NLS) [not 'The Gentle Shepherd. A Pastoral Comedy.']
