

MPhil Textile Conservation

Textile conservation is a multi-disciplinary field combining scientific analysis and a knowledge of textile history and techniques with the practical skills necessary to carry out conservation treatments. The two-year programme provides a comprehensive, career-entry professional education. It offers a fascinating combination of analytical, problem-solving and hands-on work as well as the chance to develop knowledge of our rich textile heritage and to contribute to its preservation and interpretation.

The programme is housed in new conservation laboratories in the Centre for Textile Conservation and Technical Art History. The Centre has close links with Glasgow Museums, the University's own Hunterian Museum and other cultural heritage institutions in Scotland, and students have many opportunities to meet and work with their professional staff. Students carry out professional projects for museums and other clients and undertake a work placement in a museum or other institution.
