3. The number of appeals to the Senate Appeals Committee

Appeals to Senate allow appellants who are dissatisfied with the appeals procedure at College level the opportunity to seek a review. Out of the 58 unsuccessful College appeals, 8 (14%) proceeded to become Senate appeals. For the 2012-13 and 2013-14 cohorts the equivalent figures were 26% and 23% respectively.
