## ***Week 2***

The workshops in Week 2 will be an opportunity to explore in detail themes raised in the previous week's lectures/seminars. Students will be split into smaller groups of 3-4 according to their specific research interests. Each group will be expected to design, implement and evaluate a methodological/theoretical approach to a pilot study based on a relevant theme. You should produce a short report discussing the choice of methodologies, research problems, and the strengths and weaknesses of the study. Within each group each member will be given a specific research task. Each group will be expected to give a short 15-20 minute presentation on their project on the last day of the Summer School, Friday 20 July. Each group member within a given group should be involved in the presentation which should concentrate on assessing the usefulness of the research methodologies/theories employed in helping you to achieve your project aims and briefly present your research results. Further details on the exact format and organisation of the pilot project will be circulated at the beginning of the Summer School. You are, of course, encouraged to attend group workshops other than your own.
