Pre-application - help young people to:

- > Understand the UCAS application process
- > Consider their university and course choices
 - > Research grade & subject entry requirements
 - > Check for additional admissions tests: UCAT, LNAT etc
 - Look for any work/volunteering experience requirements
- Complete their Personal Statement
- Successfully complete their UCAS application



How to Apply - UCAS

- Online application, all UK universities
- Cost to apply £27.50 for 5 choices
- Fill in application via school (UCAS centre)
- Guidance and help available via school and UCAS Hub
- UCAS deadline 31st January 2024
- Meet the school deadline for completed applications

- Rankings, reputation
- Style: campus/city based; broad-based/specialist
- Size: of campus, number of students

- > Current students Unibuddy



Choosing a course

- Interests and career aspirations
- Entry requirements
- > Course structure: including joint honours and flexible degrees
- Accreditations
- Study abroad/work placements
- Teaching and assessment
- Prospectuses/printed material
- > Web pages for most up-to-date information

How UofG present our Higher Entry Requirements

SQA Higher Entry Requirements

- BBBB is the minimum requirement from S5 to be reviewed for an S6 offer
- Offers are not guaranteed to applicants who meet the minimum from S5
- > Typically offers will be made at AAAAA by end of S6. B at Advanced Higher is equivalent to A at Higher
- Additional requirements: Higher English and a Higher Humanities subject at AA. (AB or BA may be considered).
- You should refer to the entry requirements for both subjects when applying for a joint honours degree programme. The mandatory requirements for both subjects must be met.

Minimum Highers achieved by end of S5 for consideration for offer

Offers cannot be guaranteed

Offer offers are based on S5 and S6 grades combined

Advanced Highers are 'double counted'.

Check for mandatory subject requirements.



How UofG present our Higher Adjusted grades Requirements

SQA Higher Adjusted Entry Requirements* (by end of S5 or S6)

- > MD20: BBBB (also other target groups*)
- MD40: AABB*
- Additional requirements: Higher English and a Higher Humanities subject. Successful completion of Top-Up or one of our Summer Schools.

- Top-Up completed during school year
- Summer School completed in June/July over 4 weeks

Target groups:

Care experienced, estranged, young carer, asylum seeker, refugee

Guaranteed offers for MD20 and target groups

MD40 will be prioritised

Alternative qualifications & entry routes

A Level

> AAB-BBB

Additional requirements: one A-level Humanities subject.
International Baccalaureate (IB)

≥ 36 (6,6,5 HL) – 32 (6,5,5 HL)

Additional requirements: HL English and HL Humanities subject.
 Standard HNC/HND (at college)

- HN entrants generally enter Year 1 of undergraduate study
- Required to attend and pass the University of Glasgow Summer School
- Additional requirements of specific Higher subjects

Further post-school Access routes

UofG Access to Higher Education Programme, HNC Articulation Programmes (Yr2 entry) and SWAP We accept a range of alternative qualifications and entry routes

A Level and IB requirements have a range of grades

Check for mandatory subject and additional criteria requirements.

Personal Statement - overview

- Each university will use personal statements differently
- One personal statement for all 5 choices, but don't worry, we understand this
- Don't be nervous about it! Universities want you to do well, it's an opportunity not a trap
- Lots of help & advice from school and UCAS Hub
- Have conversations with family, teachers, friends: what am I good at? what have I achieved?

Glasgow – looking to see who you are, what your achievements and aspirations are.
Professional degree programmes may have more specific personal statement requirements and want to see evidence that you understand what the profession entails and a genuine passion for the subject. Include relevant work/volunteering/community experience.

Personal Statement – top 10 tips

- 1. Be personal what are your motivations and interests?
- 2. Check spelling and grammar
- 3. Be relevant
- 4. Avoid cliches/too many quotes use your own thinking and ideas
- 5. Use evidence
- 6. Reflect on experiences and skills
- 7. Do NOT plagiarize including use of AI
- 8. Avoid jokes
- 9. Tell the truth
- 10. Be positive about yourself and what you will bring to the course



Post application - help young people to

- Monitor UCAS Hub and check offer requirements
- Monitor 'to do' list on Applicant Self Service
- Check emails for information from the universities they have applied to
- Make firm and insurance choice decisions before the deadline
- Not panic if universities are slow to make offers understand the timescales and behind-the-scenes activity involved
- Apply for SAAS funding (typically March) and student accommodation (typically July)



UCAS Hub

- Log-in & track applications
- Universities will update decisions via UCAS Hub and offer details can be viewed there too
- Where applicants reply to their offers
- Edit details, including contact details important so universities can contact you, during and after school
- Add new choices (UCAS extra/clearing)

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Applicant Self-Service



Check offers

- Check all emails and communications from the University of Glasgow
- Upload documents e.g. National 5 results, evidence of domicile



UCAS key dates and university admissions process – offers and replies

- High demand courses won't be able to make decisions until they receive all applications and know what the grade cut-offs etc will need to be.
- Applicants must wait until they receive decisions on all 5
 UCAS choices before accepting an offer.
- There is no advantage to accepting offers before the deadline.
- Don't panic if others have received their 5 decisions and you are still waiting for one or more universities to respond, admissions teams have lots of applications to process.

- 16 May date you should have received all university decisions
- 6 June date you have to make firm and insurance choices



University decision-making

- Qualifications, Personal
 Statement, Reference received
 via UCAS
- Evidence of other qualifications send via Applicant Self Service (e.g. Nat 5 results)
- Admissions tests, interview, portfolio, audition (eg LNAT, UCAT)

Decisions based upon the application and number of available spaces

Types of decision

- Conditional Offer
- Unconditional Offer
- Unsuccessful

Replies

- Firm accept
- Insurance
 - not an option if firm choice is Unconditional
 - > lower conditions offer
 - automatic transfer on results day if conditions of firm choice aren't met
 - Check UCAS Hub on Results
 Day
- Decline



Finance and Accommodation applications

Along with the UCAS application there are two other important applications that need to be completed, Student Finance and Accommodation (if applicable) **Student Finance:**

- Apply for finance funding via Student Awards Agency Scotland (SAAS) www.saas.gov.uk
- > Tuition fees covered by the government but still need to fill in an application
- Funding for living costs available
- Applications open March

Student accommodation:

- > Firm university choice and application before the deadline
- Deadline typically July
- > 360-degree tours available gla.ac.uk/undergraduate/accommodation/
