Sawubona! IHEA 2023 Congress

Cape Town offers warm greetings and a fantastic congress!

HEHTA colleagues, together with over a thousand delegates from 97 countries, received a very warm welcome



in Cape Town at the 15th International Health Economics Association (IHEA) World Congress. Hosted by the University of Cape Town from 8 to 12 July, the biennial congress was the first of its kind in Africa and brought together health economists in academia, industry, government, IGOs, and NGOs to engage in recent international health economics developments under the theme: 'Diversity in Health Economics'.

HEHTA had strong representation at the event with vibrant oral presentations and panel discussions. Heather set the ball rolling with her presentation on an extended cost-effectiveness analysis of interventions to improve diabetes services in South Africa. Eleanor moderated an animated panel session on measuring the impact of HTA institutions where Pankaj presented findings from his analysis on estimating the impact and return on investment of HTA in India. Samuel and Manuela followed up with their presentations on the role of universal health coverage in secondary prevention in Ghana and the economic impact of musculoskeletal disorders in Tanzania, respectively. To wrap it up, Sayem presented a cost-effectiveness study of outpatient balloon catheter labour induction in the UK and Nurnabi presented a system dynamics model of community-based health insurance in Bangladesh.

Not one to end such an event on a low note, team HEHTA visited the pristine Boulders Beach on the Cape Peninsula to commune with African penguins and incredibly cute rock dassies—surprisingly lilliputian cousins of elephants!
