Student Learning Development (SLD)

Arts & Humanities and Social Sciences Semester 2 2023-24 Class Timetable

These classes are specifically designed for students in the College of Arts & Humanities and College of Social Sciences at the University of Glasgow.

All Postgraduate students are encouraged to attend or engage with our classes on **Essay Writing** and **Mastering Academic Writing**. Our **Essay Writing** classes will run live and in person while our **Mastering Academic Writing** classes, which focus on the mechanics and style of academic writing, can be accessed asynchronously online using the Moodle link at the bottom of the timetable.

For International students, we also offer live and in person tailored sessions focusing on developing a dissertation project in a UK university context: our **Early Stages Dissertation Writing** classes. All students are welcome to attend all classes, regardless of whether they are International students or not.

Postgraduate students wishing to start thinking about their dissertations can also engage asynchronously with our **Postgraduate Dissertation** classes, which can also be accessed using the Moodle link at the bottom of the timetable. However, we will run a full series of live **Postgraduate Dissertation** classes in the summer semester.

If you are thinking about or are in the process of applying for jobs, we are also running **Graduate Numeracy** lectures and tutorials to help you gain the confidence and skills to undertake the kind of graduate numeracy and numerical reasoning tests used by many employers.
