# **INITIAL STAGES**

- Establish clear research objectives and methodologies with your supervisory team to create a firm foundation for successful research
- Understand the format of regular contact, formal and informal, with your supervisors (what you can expect from each other and how best to work together)

#### **SUPERVISORY SUPPORT**

- Regular meetings per year (12 for full-time students; 6 for part-time students)
- Annual progress review with academic support to ensure you are on track and receive formal feedback on any changes required
