Student Learning Development (SLD) Transitions Semester 1 2025-26 Session Timetable

These sessions are designed to help you successfully transition through key stages of your first semester as a UofG student.

Some sessions are specifically for **new** Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught students (as indicated in the UG/PGT/All column) and some are particularly for specific student cohorts (Commuting/Local, Mature, Part-Time, or Online/Distance Learning students).

There are a range of different session types, including **Building Community** check-in sessions to discuss and reflect on your progress at various points in the semester, **Navigating Semester 1** classes focusing on key transitions-oriented academic skills, **Drop-In** sessions where you can discuss your first semester so far and get advice from an SLD Adviser, and **Workshops** where you can bring your own coursework, assessments, or applications to work on in a focused and supported environment.
