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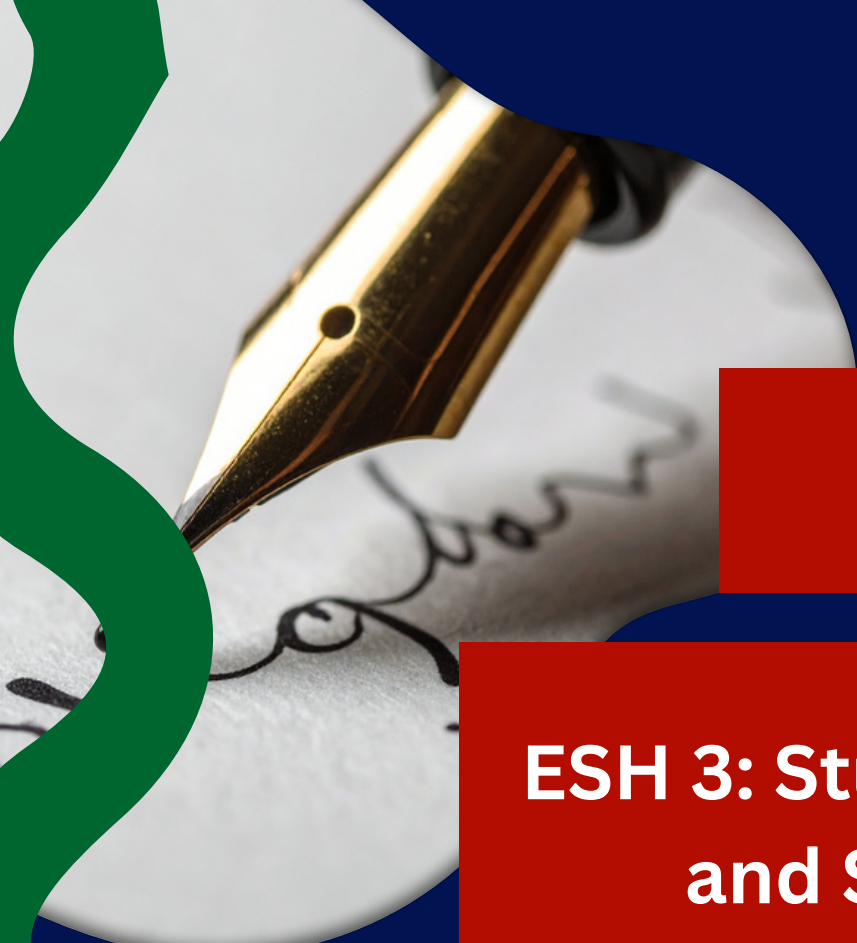

ESH 3: Studies in Economic and Social History

- Develop skills in historiography, critical analysis, and debates on a theme related to economic and social history, 1775-2000.
- Acquire intensive training by analysing historical texts, identifying and examining historical debates, and applying your knowledge.

Researching Economic and Social History

- Develop historiography, bibliographical, and analytical skills using primary sources and organising research findings effectively in written and oral presentations.
- Build teamwork and encourage a reflective approach and self-directed learning through group-working on a project and on a presentation.



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ESH4048

Families, Society and the State in Britain, 1750 - 1914

- Examine changes and continuities in family formation in the UK (ideas of love and courtship practices), family function, and relationships within families and extended families.
- Explore the changing expectations of men and women in relation to the family, along with class differences, inclusive of family factors like single parents, divorce, and stepfamily dynamics.

Sexualities and Social Control, 1885 - 1980

- Investigate the development of distinct sexual identities how these were scrutinised, regulated and experienced.
- Track diverse processes which sought to criminalise, medicalise and pathologise 'deviant' sexualities in Britain.
- Engage with legal, social, political, medical and religious attitudes to diverse sexualities.



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ESH4082

Cuba: Resilient Revolution

- Gain a long-term perspective of Cuban development with a focus on the post-1959 decades.
- Investigate the history, society, politics, and economics in revolutionary Cuba.
- Examine Cuba's international relations, including with the United States.



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ESH4086

Oral History for Social Scientists

- Gain the skills and experiences of an oral historian by working with archival testimonies, recording your own interviews, or even creating an original podcast.
- Explore the development of oral history practice and theory in dialogue with insights from related methods such as ethnography.
- Discover the development of oral history practice to understand power, ethical responsibility and relationships to other methods.



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ESH4088

The British Empire and India, 1757-1947

- Explore the history of Britain's Indian Empire from the formal establishment of East India Company rule in 1757 until India's independence in 1947.
- Examine how indigenous Indian systems and British colonial frameworks interacted to shape administration, law, society and the economy.
- Unpack the complexities of contact between the coloniser and the colonised.



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ESH4092

British Capitalism and its Discontents

- Explore the political foundations and current dynamics that have shaped Britain's economy, and engage in debates around the past, present and future.
- Investigate the history and politics of contemporary challenges, such as: deindustrialisation; net zero and climate change; the future of the Union; Brexit; inequalities, power and wealth; and the legacies of empire.



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ESH4095

Anger, Fear, Love, Nostalgia: The History of Emotions

- Investigate how emotions can be identified, interpreted, and measured in historical contexts.
- Examine how emotional experiences are universal or shaped by specific social, cultural, political, and economic environments.
- Explore how historians are interpreting emotions from the past, and how emotional expressions have motivated and impacted historical events and actors.



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ESH4096

Bodies of Knowledge: Histories of Gender and Health

- Examine gender theory through the topic of health, exploring the ways in which societal and medical understandings of sex and gender binaries have impacted health and wellbeing.
- Discover significant moments in history which exemplify the relationship between gender and health from the mid-18th century into the 21st century.



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SPS4008

West European Relations with Central and East Europe from Détente to EU

- Discover the nature and development of West European relations with Central and East European (CEE) countries.
- Explore the onset of Détente in the 1960s to the collapse of Socialist regimes in 1989 and the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991.
- Investigate the early 2000s when CEE countries established closer ties with Western European nations, leading to their integration in the EU.



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SPS4009

Socialism: A Global History

- Discover the roots of the rise and fall of socialist regimes such as Russia and China in the 20th century.
- Examine the history of socialism as a global phenomenon by focusing primarily on its political, economic and diplomatic aspects, as well as cultural and social history elements.



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SPS4013

The John Smith Youth Poll Project

- Set the themes and write the questions for the high-profile annual UK Youth Poll, shaping the national political discussion around young people.
- Develop practical skills including writing and analysing polls, pitching news stories and writing press releases, writing for public audiences, and managing research projects.



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
