The 4th floating seminar invites you to reflect upon one of the core questions of research – METHODOLOGY. As is known, having a good subject is rarely enough, what is needed is also a suitable method to meet the demands posed by the topic. At times, even collecting the research material might pose crucial questions and problems, which we also invite you to discuss.

The seminar is open for graduate students from the Nordic countries; we are happy to have been able to invite also a group from the UK to participate. Maximum 40 PhD students will be selected based on the registrations. The organisers will cover travel costs and meals for the participants.

Prior to the event (dl 14.10.2011), the participating PhD students should write a max 10 000 signs (incl. spaces) abstract of their Ph D project, discussing the topic from the point of view of methodology. Questions to be considered are, for instance, the choice of a certain method or combination of methods, reflecting upon alternative choices; also, the pros and cons of certain theories; is there something in the material that doesn't comply with a given methodology? Furthermore, questions dealing with collection of the research material (archive, fieldwork, statistics) can also be treated in the paper.

The floating seminar offers a brilliant forum to discuss these questions in an interdisciplinary, international and innovative group of both senior researchers and PhD students, all specialising in Russian and East European studies! See the preliminary schedule below!
