HOW TO BUY

IN PERSON & OVER THE PHONE

You can purchase tickets for most events from GFT Box Office during opening hours (daily from 12.00–20.00).

ONLINE

Most tickets can be purchased from the website www.glasgowfilm.org/festival. Tickets for GFT events can be purchased online up until 1 hour before the performance. Tickets for events at other venues can be purchased online until 21.00 the day before the performance.

COLLECTION

You can collect your advance tickets from GFT Box Office up until 15 minutes after the last screening starts the day before the performance. On the day of the event, tickets must be picked up at the venue where the film is being shown or the event is being held.

Please bring proof of eligibility when purchasing or collecting tickets. If you're lucky enough to look older than 21, please bring valid proof of age like your Uni matriculation or Young Scot card.

CERTIFICATION

Films not certificated by the BBFC are marked N/C and accompanied by an age recommendation, e.g. N/C 15+ (suitable for 15 and older, no-one under 15 will be admitted).




