Professor Philip Hanson OBE is an Associate Fellow, Chatham House, and Emeritus Professor of the Political Economy of Russia and Eastern Europe, Centre for Russian and East European Studies, University of Birmingham. He has carried out research on the Soviet and post-Soviet economic systems and specialises in Russian macroeconomic issues and policies, Russia's regional economic issues and Russia-EU economic relations.

Dr Adam Swain is an Associate Professor of Economic Geography at the University of Nottingham. He researches the contemporary Ukrainian economy and the history of academic geography.
