We offer a clinical referral service, on-farm health consultancy and consultancy to government, pharmaceutical and livestock industries, as well as undertaking basic and applied research in farm animal and public health. We are based within the School of Veterinary Medicine, University of Glasgow and our responsibilities include teaching undergraduate and postgraduate veterinary students and training of veterinary residents as specialist farm animal and public health practitioners.
