



Dr Carl Goodyear

Senate Assessor

Institute of Infection, Immunity & Inflammation

Carl was elected as a Senate Assessor on Court in October 2014 and has been a member of Senate since 2011. He studied at the University of Glasgow and Glasgow Caledonian University, gaining a BSc with honours in Molecular Biology in 1996 and a PhD in Molecular Immunology in 1999. Upon completing his PhD, he moved to the US and worked in the Department of Medicine at the University of California at San Diego where he eventually held the position of Assistant Professor. During this period he was awarded a Cancer Research Institute Postdoctoral Fellowship, became a National Blood Foundation Scholar, and received a number of awards including the National Blood Foundation David B. Pall Prize for Innovative Research in Transfusion Medicine and an Arthritis Foundation Investigator Award. In 2006 he returned to work in the UK at the Institute of Infection Immunity and Inflammation in the University of Glasgow. He was awarded a prestigious Arthritis Research UK Fellowship and shortly after became a Reader. His research has continued to gain awards such as the Inaugural Medical Research Scotland Vipiana Award. Carl's research group is currently focused on understanding immunopathogenesis of disease (i.e., Rheumatoid Arthritis, Osteoarthritis & Multiple Myeloma) and translating this knowledge into viable therapeutic agents for patients. In parallel, Carl is the Director of the GLAZgo Discovery Centre and also leads a Translational Immunology programme, which provides the critical interface between clinical and basic science. He teaches on the undergraduate Immunology course and is involved in the course co-ordination. Until recently Carl was also an advisor of studies for Undergraduate students.

Outwith Glasgow, Carl is a Visiting Research Fellow at the University of Birmingham, University of Newcastle and the University of the West of Scotland.
