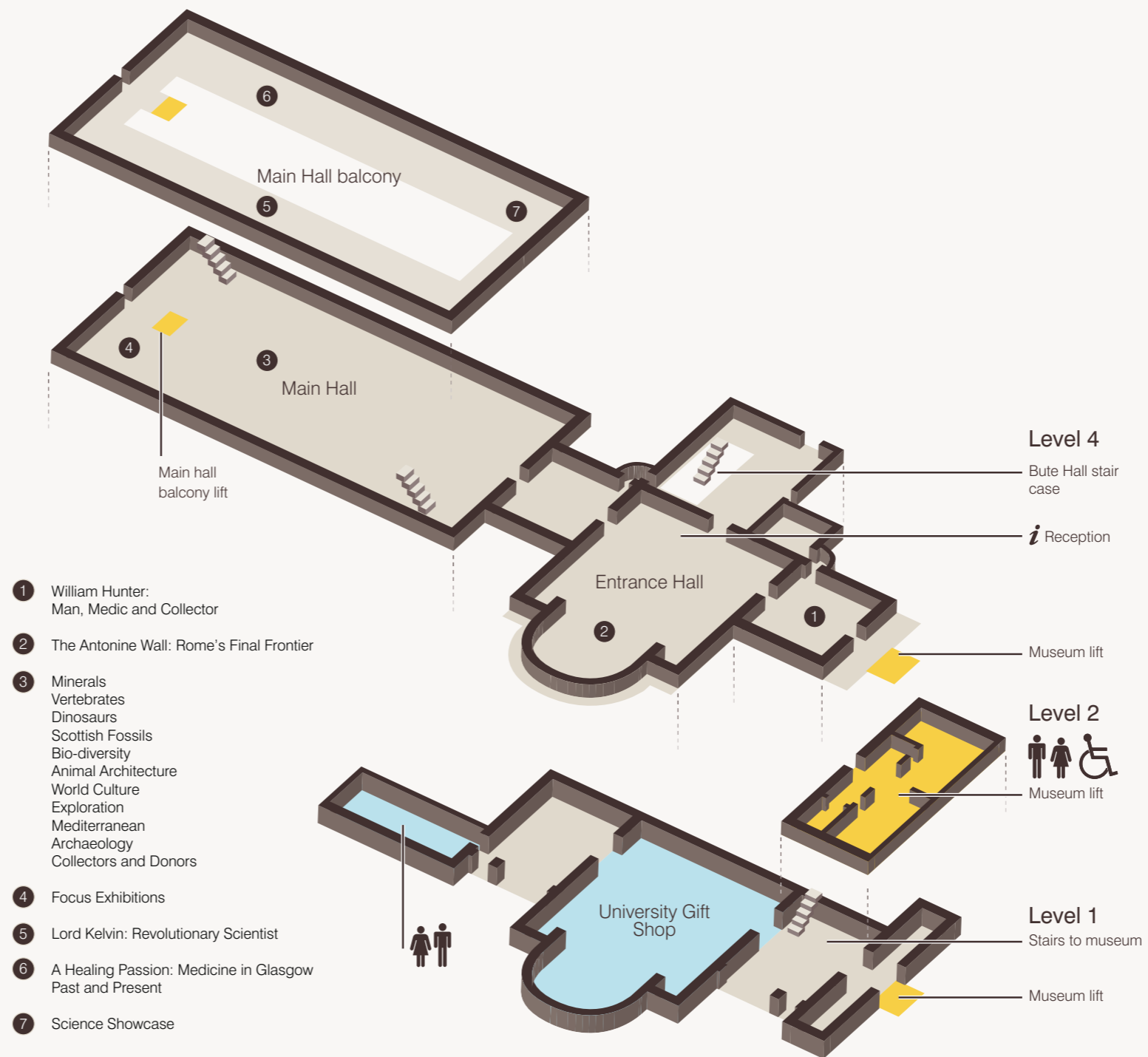


# THE HUNTERIAN

# THE HUNTERIAN ART GALLERY AND THE MACKINTOSH HOUSE FLOOR PLAN

The Hunterian Art Gallery is home to a wide range of outstanding works. Our collections include masterpieces by Rembrandt, Rubens, Chardin, Stubbs and Whistler and major examples of Scottish Art including the Scottish Colourists and Glasgow Boys. The Gallery is also home to The Mackintosh House, the reassembled interiors of the home of Charles Rennie Mackintosh.

## OPENING HOURS

The Hunterian Museum, Hunterian Art Gallery and The Mackintosh House are open Tuesday – Saturday 10.00am – 5.00pm and Sunday 11.00am – 4.00pm. Closed Monday. Admission to The Mackintosh House is by guided tour on weekday mornings and self-guided in the afternoon and at weekends. Last admission 4.15pm (3.15pm Sunday).

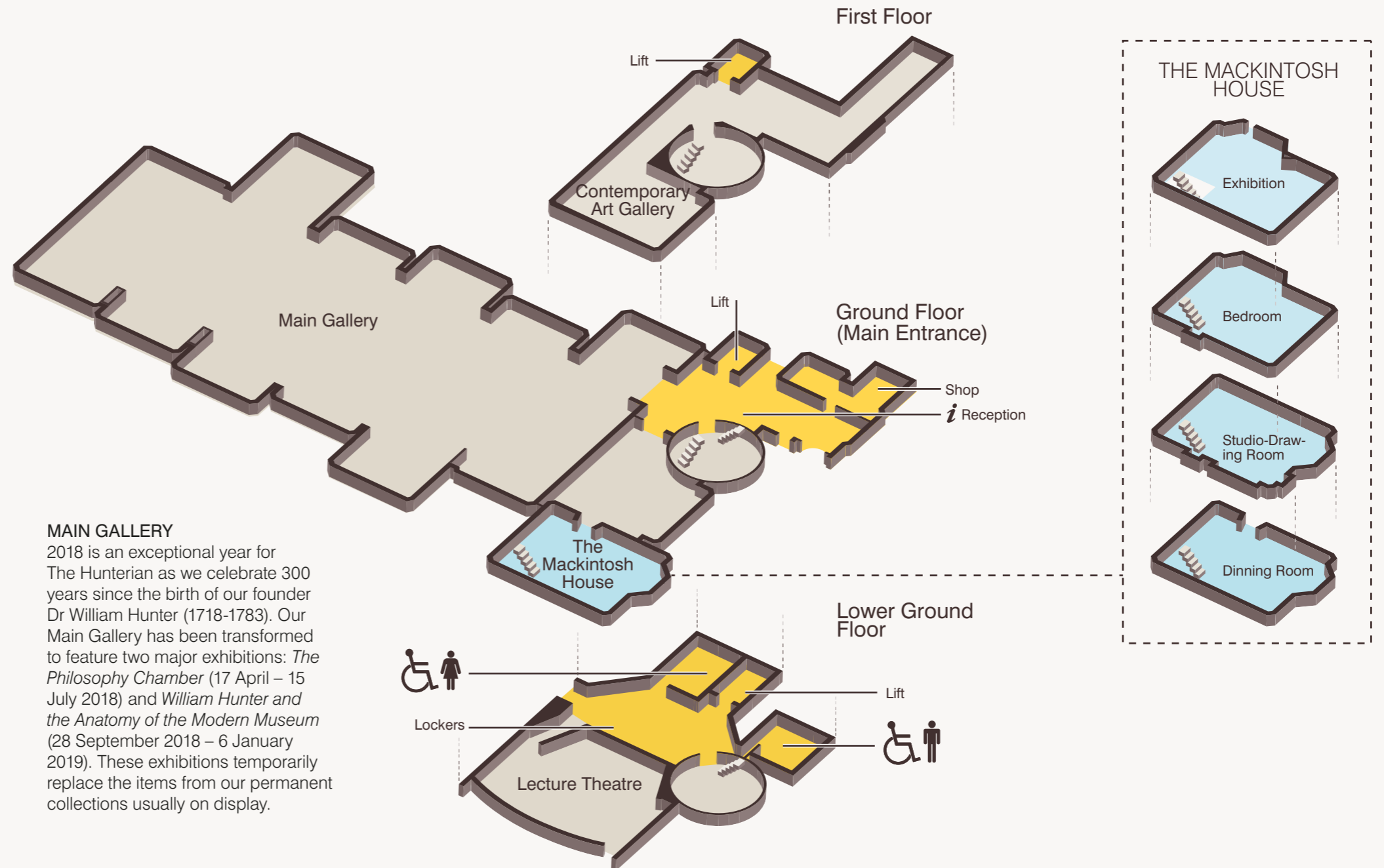
## DISABLED ACCESS

Access in the Art Gallery is by ramp to the ground floor then by lift to the basement and first floor Contemporary Art Gallery. Because of the nature of The Mackintosh House, disabled access is limited to the orientation room, hall and dining room. Accessible toilets are located on the lower ground floor of the Art Gallery.

## MAIN GALLERY

2018 is an exceptional year for The Hunterian as we celebrate 300 years since the birth of our founder Dr William Hunter (1718-1783). Our Main Gallery has been transformed to feature two major exhibitions: *The Philosophy Chamber* (17 April – 15 July 2018) and *William Hunter and the Anatomy of the Modern Museum* (28 September 2018 – 6 January 2019). These exhibitions temporarily replace the items from our permanent collections usually on display.
