Evaluated effectiveness of replacing of CFCs with HCFCs (primarily in USA) and HCs (primarily in Europe) in arresting and reversing ozone depletion. Evaluated relative effect on global warming of HCs and HCFCs. Research utilised contacts in Germany, UK and USA. Excellent feedback from Supervisor.
