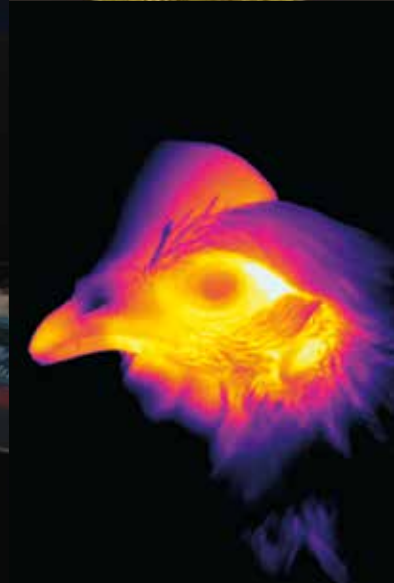

WELCOME

The first half of 2019 brings some very exciting exhibitions. Dinosaur fans shouldn't miss the major exhibition *T. rex in Town* at Kelvin Hall, which features one of the world's most complete *Tyrannosaurus rex* skeletons.

At the Hunterian Museum, *Byzantium: A Golden Era of Coinage*, is a fascinating new exhibition which displays coins from the extraordinary Byzantine Empire. And our new Science Showcase, *Thermographica: The Thermal World of Birds*, features new University of Glasgow research using thermal imaging.

There will be limited access to some parts of the Hunterian Art Gallery in early 2019, but the Mackintosh House remains open as usual. Our major new exhibition *The German Revolution: Expressionist Prints* opens in March along with the touring exhibition *Hand Drawn Action Packed*. Our redisplayed permanent galleries will open in May.

Items from our collections are also on display at Kelvin Hall and The Hunterian in the South on the University's Crichton Campus in Dumfries.

THE GERMAN REVOLUTION:

EXPRESSIONIST PRINTS

Featuring works from The Hunterian's pioneering collection of German Expressionist prints, this major exhibition explores artists' responses to the German Revolution of 1918-1919. Presenting works by stellar artists such as Munch, Nolde, Schiele, Kokoschka, Kollwitz, Beckmann, Picasso, Goya and Gauguin, *The German Revolution* explores this turbulent period, linking the strong German tradition of graphic art with the social and political, sexual and moral struggles taking place at the time.

Step back in time to the Cretaceous period and meet Trix, Europe's first Tyrannosaurus rex. The 66-million-year-old fossil is the centrepiece of this major exhibition and one of the three most complete Tyrannosaurus rex skeletons in the world. Find out more about Trix's turbulent life from the information revealed by her bones, based on recent findings by an international research team of palaeontologists and geologists.

This exhibition is organised by The Hunterian and Glasgow Museums.



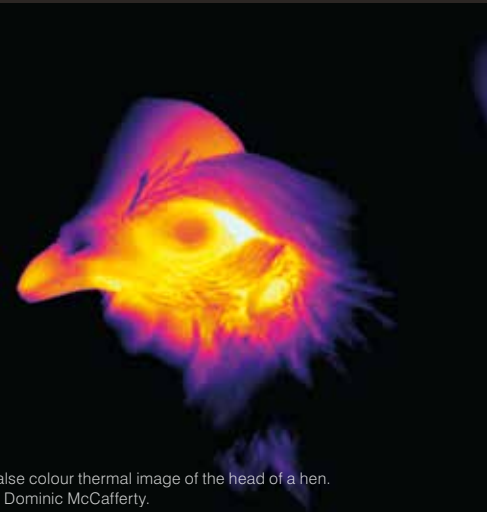
BYZANTIUM: A GOLDEN ERA OF COINAGE

For a thousand years, the Byzantine Empire dominated the eastern Mediterranean. Centred on the capital of Constantinople, it was a beacon of Roman power, Greek influence and Christian worship, which spanned the ancient and medieval worlds. Telling the story of the Byzantine era through its coinage, this exhibition features over 150 rare gold, silver and base metal coins, reflecting dramatic periods of history and a golden age of coinage from an extraordinary civilization.

THERMOGRAPHICA: THE THERMAL WORLD OF BIRDS

Thermal imaging is now being used by biologists to gain many fascinating insights into the thermal biology of animals. In this Science Showcase exhibition, we highlight how researchers at the University of Glasgow are using thermal imaging to explore the thermal world of birds. Thermal images show how birds are adapted to cold and why thermography is a useful technique to monitor the welfare of captive and wild birds. The exhibition also features a display of thermal cameras to show how rapidly the technology is advancing, making it available for further scientific research.

HAND DRAWN ACTION PACKED

Curated by Hayward Gallery Touring, this exhibition brings together the work of ten international artists including Marcel van Eeden, Marcel Dzama, Rinus Van de Velde and Otobong Nkanga. Each artist's practice illustrates how drawings can tell complex stories with the simplest of means. The artists portray an array of subject matter, such as human relationships, geography, politics and mythology, in materials that range from traditional pencil and charcoal, to modern methods of animation.
