

MBChB Student Professionalism Concerns

Medical School guidance on professionalism, 'Professional Practice Guidance' can be found in the Professionalism section of Moodle, which identifies where students can access information on professional standards and related support.

It is understood that issues experienced by students in undergraduate training can follow or resurface in their working lives as doctors. The following guidance outlines the policy and process for students who have professionalism concerns raised during their undergraduate programme.

MBChB Professional Concerns Register

The Medical School keeps a register of students who have either raised concerns themselves or have had concerns raised about them by staff and/or colleagues. This is a register of concerns that does not automatically constitute referral to a fitness to practise investigation, but serves as a record, should patterns of behaviour of further concerns be raised. As part of the current arrangements for the UK professional registration scheme, the Medical School provides the GMC with a list of graduating students who are on the register. This is to ensure the registration process runs as smoothly (and quickly) as possible with regard to disclosure. Students on the register are advised to contact the Medical School at the start of their final year of study.
