Craig started work at the University of Glasgow during the summer of 1980. His first post was as a trainee technician in the Institute of Physiology which was a part of the West Medical Building (where he still works to this day). Having worked through various promotions to Senior Technician he then switched to an academic post (Research Associate) in 1994 whilst studying (part-time) for a Masters and then PhD in Medical Science. In 1999 he was promoted to Research Fellow then University Teacher, Senior University Teacher and is currently a Senior Lecturer within the School of Life Sciences, MVLS.

Currently Honorary Secretary of the University of Glasgow branch of the Universities and Colleges Union (UCU).

Craig has a broad teaching portfolio covering mainly physiology, pharmacology and neuroscience. He has acted as external examiner at several universities and is currently the physiology/pharmacology examiner for the University of Nottingham Biomedical Science degree. Course design and management has featured heavily in Craig's career, mainly as; physiology programme coordinator (11 years), Autonomic Nervous System (14 years), Bioluminescence (8 years).

With over 150 publications, Craig is often asked to examine PhD students and review manuscripts and research grants. In recent years his research focus has turned more to the use of Virtual Reality and other 3D imaging modalities for enhancing teaching and learning.
