Expectations of University

More freedom & flexibility in what they are studying – more courses & combinations	Skills to enter the workforce (embedded in study, employability)	Expectations of 1 st year not matching (hours/how much to revise, social aspect)	Thought they would need to focus more on academics instead of what they really need
Transparency of course before arriving – course was miss-sold	Independence (positive) – wanted out of their comfort zone	Intellectual discussions expected – sharing ideas.	Learning more difficult subject matter
Broad learning – not specific enough	Not enough contact hours (lack of)	Group Work	Too independent too soon perhaps

Flexible Degree Structure

- A massive selling point to students
- However, not flexible enough in practice
- More choice wanted in 1st & 2nd year
- More choice in 3rd subject
 - Medics take 5 weeks out to study something different
- Opportunity to obtain more skills
 - Languages for International Mobility
 - Coding, business, policy & strategy
