Annual Tuition Fees	The fee for all courses will be £9,250 per annum For all four or five year courses (except BDS Dentistry, MBChB Medicine and BVMS Veterinary Medicine) one year of tuition will be free (usually final year but varies by course). The fee for a standard four year Honours degree will, therefore, be £27,750.
