

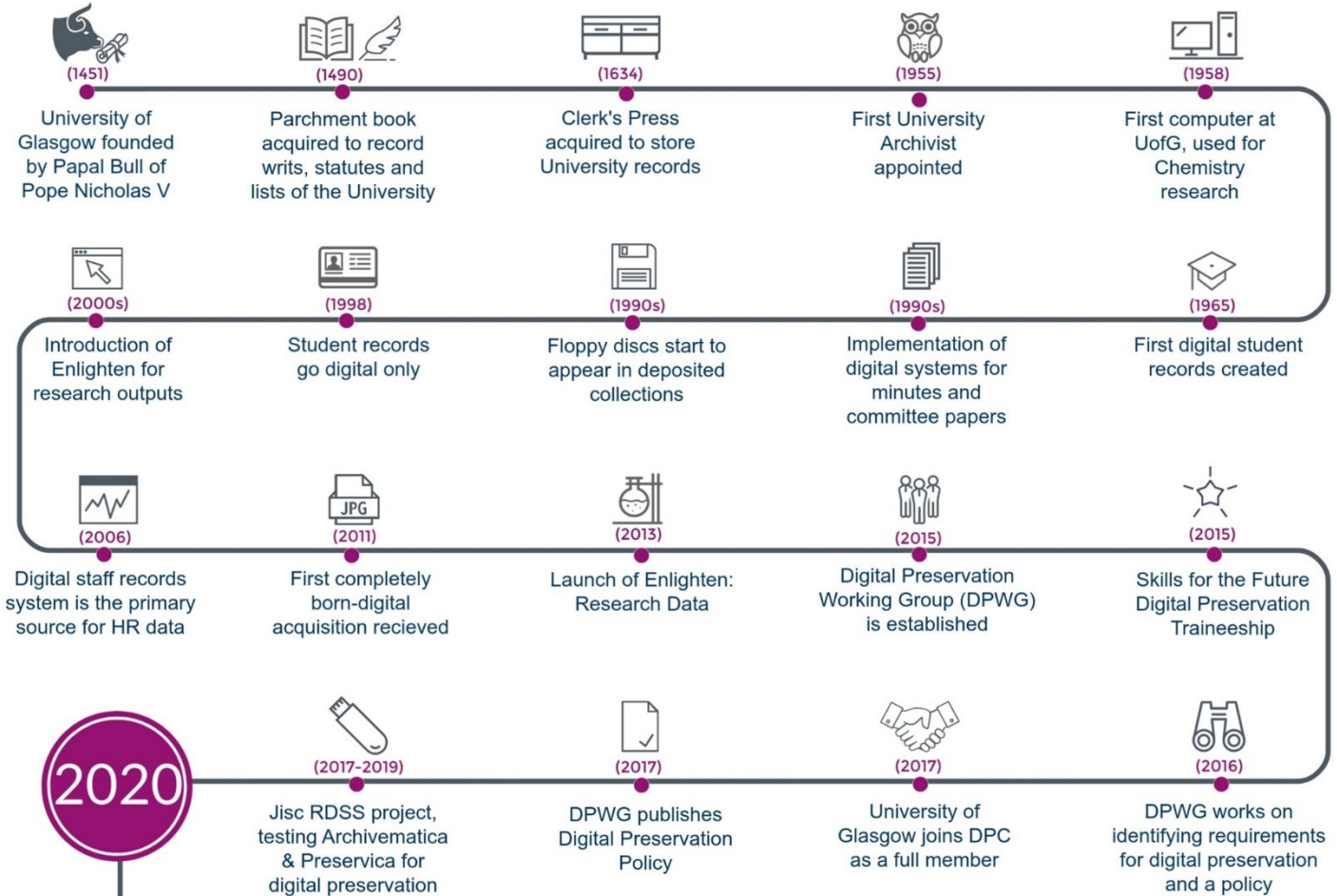


## Our digital transformation

University of Glasgow Archives & Special Collections cares for records that the University has been creating and curating since 1451.

As early adopters of digital records and processes, we need to ensure continuity of care for these records. This is particularly important as the University's ongoing world-changing transformation harnesses digital to enhance the staff and student experience.

We are working towards ensuring that our digital records created today remain accessible in another 569 years.



### CHALLENGES

- Interest and focus on digital assets is on current use - we need to widen this to include long-term preservation and access
- External drivers for digital curation focus on research data rather than university administrative records - it falls on us to promote internal drive

### GOALS

- Build a digital preservation service encompassing all facets of digital curation, including a digital archive service
- Have confidence in the digital preservation service maintaining the record
- Extend conversation and activities within UofG to include long-term preservation and access

### ACTIONS

- Implement Archivematica via the Jisc Open Research Hub to perform preservation actions on Archives & Special Collections collections, theses and research data
- Integrate digital actions into Archives & Special Collections collection management policies and procedures
- Investigate web archiving, with a view to preserving the University's web heritage and social media presence
