#### Monitoring and evaluation

- A key concern for Executive
- "What will success look like?"
- Need for national and local picture
- Not just incidence outcomes too
- Perception and reporting
- Multi-agency dimension
- "Expectation, expectation, expectation..."

#### Work in progress

- "Accountability framework" a team effort
- "Who/what/how?"
- Incidence, performance, perception
- Using existing information and joining-up

## Work in progress (cont'd)

A framework at three levels:

- ➤ High level/strategic outcomes
- Delivery of individual measures and performance monitoring
- ➤ In-depth analysis/case studies
