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North Lanarkshire Council

- 4th Largest Council in Scotland
- Largest public sector landlord in Scotland -42,000 tenants (Council voted to retain stock)

Lanarkshire

- Located in West Central Scotland bordering Glasgow - close to Edinburgh
- Population 320,000

Background to the Anti Social Task Force (ASTF)

- Team of specialist officers for serious ASB set up in 2001 - 9 staff
- Expanded to current establishment of 34 - Including Legal team
- Utilised council and Scottish Executive funding
- NLC residents/members consulted widely on team and remit Lanarkshire


ASTF deals with all tenures

Anti Social task Force -Statistical Information

- Approx 5,000 cases referred to the ASTF
- Over 280 cases being investigated at any given time
- 118 ASBO applications made 100 Granted (Remainder Pending)
- 20 Interim ASBO applications made 18 granted (Remainder Pending)
- 7 Eviction Orders granted

Methods used to Tackle Anti Social Behaviour

- Multi Agency Working Pro Active
- Services inc. Mediation, Pro Witness -24 Hours
- Incremental Warnings NOPs
- UBNs & ABAs-Innovative Approaches
- ASBOs/Interim ASBOs
- Short Scottish Secure Tenancies
- Tenancy Support
- Work Closely with RSLs



Methods used to Tackle Anti Social Behaviour

- Build Community Confidence
- Regular attendance at Public Meetings
- Training and awareness meetings in communities
- Extensive joint working with Police in schools and communities
- Tackle "Hot Spot" Areas
- Use eviction as last resort



Anti Social Task Force -Success of methods used

- Effective multi agency approach
- Popular and effective mediation and professional witness service
- Formal support service for victims and witnesses
- Almost all ASBO applications granted at hearings - majority not breached
- Breached ASBOs dealt with effectively by police and courts


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Anti Social Task Force -Success of methods used

- Currently funded mainly through HRA
- Consideration being given to Council Tax contribution
- Exec funding accessed successfully
- Service Level Agreement with RSLs
- Consultancy Service

- ASBOs for under 16s
- ASB Strategies (joint with police)
- Acceptable Behaviour Contracts
- Strengthened Powers to deal with other landlords
- Piloting Good Neighbour Declarations
- Protection for victims and witnesses of ASB
- Neighbourhood Compacts



Anti Social Task Force Why a Specialist team?

- Good experience in a complex field
- Clear responsibilities for staff
- Improved efficiency/effectiveness
- Improved access to services
- Higher profile and awareness of issues and tools to tackle ASB
- Improved multi agency working
- Improved links with community
- Shows commitment of LA



ASTF - What can be learned from our Experience?

- Specialist Teams do work
- Joint Working/Training is vital
- ASBOs are extremely effective
- Professional Witnessing is essential
- Support for victims/witnesses is required
- Mediation can be used in ASB cases
- Co-operation from communities is essential and beneficial
