 - Strategic funding review

 - Social economy development
 - Business management
 - Voluntary sector grants management
 - Cross-Departmental liaison

Closing the Opportunity Gap

- To **Prevent** individuals or families from falling into poverty
- To **Provide routes out** of poverty for individuals and families
- To **Sustain** individuals or families in a lifestyle free from poverty

Closing the Opportunity Gap

- Coverage
 - Employability
 - Children
 - Regeneration
 - Financial inclusion
 - Health
 - Rural issues

Housing

• Increasing investment

- Target for affordable house building raised from the current three-year target of 18,000 new approvals to 21,500
 - 16,500 homes for social rent
 - 5,000 for low-cost home ownership

Housing

• Tackling homelessness and waiting lists

- By 2012 to give all homeless people the entitlement to a permanent home
- Also improving availability of social housing for rent for people on housing waiting lists

Housing

- Supporting aspirations
 - Increase in low-cost homes
 - Aspirations of people on modest incomes
 - Seeking to move into home ownership
 - Priced out of the market in areas of high demand
