

### James McCune Smith: Information sheet

#### How to use this sheet

This information sheet gives a brief overview of <u>James McCune Smith</u>'s connection with the University of Glasgow and related records held in the University of Glasgow Library. James McCune Smith is the first known African American graduate in medicine, as well as a doctor he is celebrated as an intellectual, abolitionist and medical activist.

After being denied entry to American colleges due to his race he attended the University of Glasgow from 1832 to 1837. During his studies in Glasgow he obtained three university degrees – a Bachelor of Arts (1835), a Master of Arts (1836) and his Medical Doctorate (1837). In 2021 the University of Glasgow's new world-leading learning and teaching building was named the James McCune Smith Learning Hub in his honour.
