Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Who can I contact about the trial if I have questions?

Q. Who can take part in the trial?

A. Children between the ages of 5-12 who are adopted or in a permanent foster placement.

Q. What areas is the trial happening in?

A. We are recruiting participants in: Lanarkshire

Q. What is the time commitment involved in taking part?

A. The research questionnaires will take a few hours and are completed at baseline and repeated after 12-months. Participating families who are randomised to the DDP arm will be asked to take part in 20-24 session of DDP over a 12-month period. Time commitment for participating families randomised to Services as Usual will vary depending on what is available by your agency providing support.

Q. Would I have to travel to take part?

A. All of the research visits can be conducted remotely, families may need to travel to receive DDP or other services.











Q. I have two children that fit the criteria, can they both take part?

A. Unfortunately, only one child per family can take part at one time.

Q. If I agree to take part now, can I change my mind later?

A. You can change your mind at any time. Your care will not be affected at any time by declining to participate or withdrawing from the trial.
