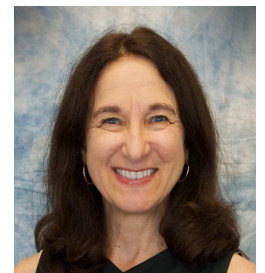

Mary Peters Sellars-Polchow Chair in Psychiatry, Professor of Psychiatry and Paediatrics at the Tulane University School of Medicine in New Orleans. Directs the Institute of Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health at Tulane. Throughout his career, he has studied the effects of adverse early experiences on development, including trauma, abuse and neglect. Also has studied interventions designed to enhance recovery following exposure to adverse experience and published widely on these topics.

**5.15 – 6.15 pm Professor Julie Larrieu****My brother's in heaven: Treatment of trauma using child-parent psychotherapy**

Developmental and clinical psychologist, Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioural Sciences at Tulane University School of Medicine, New Orleans. Chief of the Psychology Division and a senior trainer at the Institute of Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health. Supervising psychologist at the Tulane Comprehensive Assessment and Treatment Team, a multidisciplinary team that provides intensive intervention to maltreated children and their families. Site director for the Tulane component of the Early Trauma Treatment Network, a program within the National Child Traumatic Stress Network. This program is disseminating Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) for children ages birth to six who have experienced interpersonal violence and sudden loss. Julie is an international trainer for Child-Parent Psychotherapy and has trained several NSPCC clinicians and supervisors in the model. Julie's ongoing research interests include developmental psychopathology, child abuse and neglect, and symptoms arising from early trauma.
