## **Kenneth Gibb**

Kenneth Gibb is Professor of Housing Economics and Head of the Department of Urban Studies at the University of Glasgow. He completed degrees in Political Economy and Politics (MA social sciences, honours, 1986, Glasgow) and a postgraduate MPhil, also from Glasgow (1988). Kenneth has worked in the Department and its predecessors since 1989, researching and teaching in the areas of housing markets, housing supply, practical market analysis, social housing, policy evaluation and public policy, more generally.



During his career he has undertaken funded research for a number of clients, including the Economic and Social Research Council, the Scottish Office, Scottish Executive, Scottish Homes, Communities Scotland, local authorities, English Government Departments (e.g. ODPM), the Monopolies and Mergers /Commission, Joseph Rowntree Foundation, OECD, the World Bank, Council of Mortgage Lenders, the Northern Ireland Housing Executive, Welsh Assembly Government and others. Kenneth has authored or co-authored more than 50 published research reports, co-authored or co-edited several books on housing economics and housing finance and authored or co-authored more than 25 peer-reviewed academic journal articles.

Kenneth is an editor of the Urban Studies Journal and is a Director of the European Real Estate Society. Outside of work, he is a Trustee of the Scottish Power Energy People's Trust. Kenneth is also Chairman of Sanctuary Scotland housing association and chairs Sanctuary Management Services.
